Genesis Summit 2020 Update

The events of 2020 have disrupted and radically altered our lives and our ministries. This year's Genesis Summit gathered ministry leaders from across Canada to discuss the theme of spirituality and suffering, for such a time as this.

Rev. Dr. Phil Zylla, McMaster Divinity College, Academic Vice-President and author of *The Roots of Sorrow: A Pastoral Theology of Suffering* was our keynote speaker. His four keynote sessions touched on the Posture of Compassion, Staying Near to Suffering, the Fragility of Life: Vulnerability and Sorrow, A Spirituality of Suffering and lastly Suffering and Ministry where a foundational framework for the next phase of ministry was established.

Our breakout sessions embraced formation and suffering throughout church/ministry life and included sessions on preaching, theology, and companioning those who suffer. Attendees found rest in a half-day experiential retreat, designed to be reproduced within participants' churches and ministries.

Participants will have the opportunity to hear from the author, ask questions, and engage in discussion.

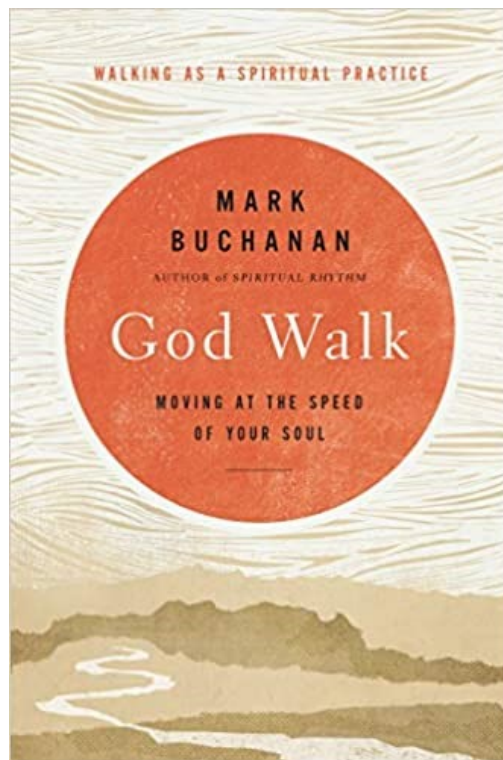
Our first guest author is **Mark Buchanan**, joining us to discuss his new book:

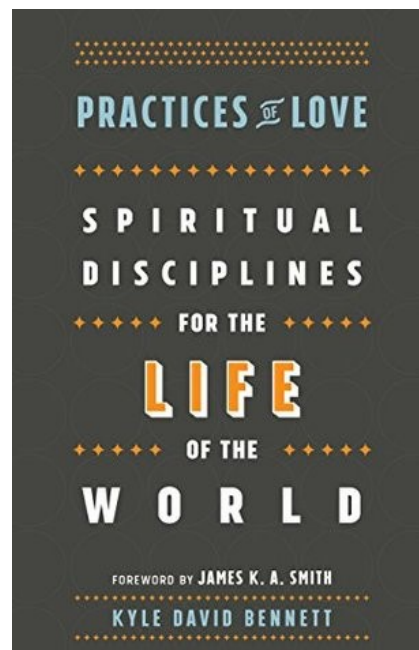
